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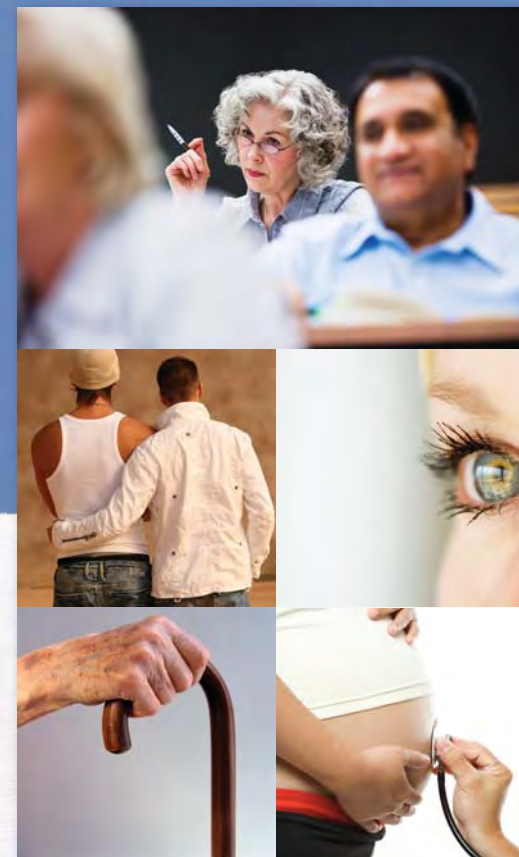

## Our Mission

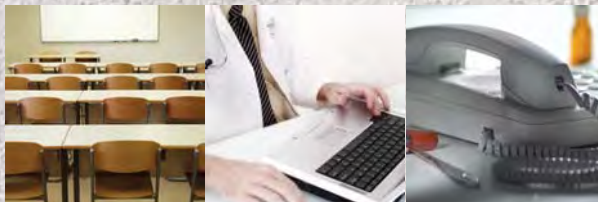
To educate health care providers about management of HIV infection, including prevention, diagnosis, treatment, and psychosocial issues.



## Clinical Programs

The NMAETC can assist health care providers across New Mexico by bringing educational programming to your facility. Individualized programs may include, but are not limited to:

- Discussions about the basic science and epidemiology of HIV/AIDS
- Recommendations for routine testing
- Updates on antiretroviral treatment and adverse drug reactions
- Treatment of comorbidities
- Treatment of special populations (youth, pregnant women, elderly, migrant populations and LGBT)
- Cultural awareness and health disparity issues



## Clinical Consultation

In addition to trainings at your facility, NMAETC physicians with HIV expertise are available for clinical consultations by telephone or e-mail. We are happy to answer HIV questions, discuss cases, or provide technical assistance and resources to improve HIV patient care.

## Minisabbatical

One to three day clinical training program consisting of didactic sessions and rotations at various clinical sites in Albuquerque or Denver are available. The training is individualized, to the extent possible, to meet the professional learning goals, practice needs, and interests of the participant. Upon request, NMAETC can provide funding for transportation and housing.

## HIV/AIDS ECHO Telemedicine Clinic

The HIV ECHO Telemedicine Clinic unites a multidisciplinary team of HIV experts with providers caring for HIV-infected patients/clients in rural and underserved areas. Individual cases are presented by the treating provider (i.e. MD, Mid-level, RN, Case Manager) and discussed by the group to provide consultative advice on the management of HIV patients. Relevant peer-reviewed articles and resources are circulated to participants to enhance their knowledge base and CME/CEU credits are provided.
